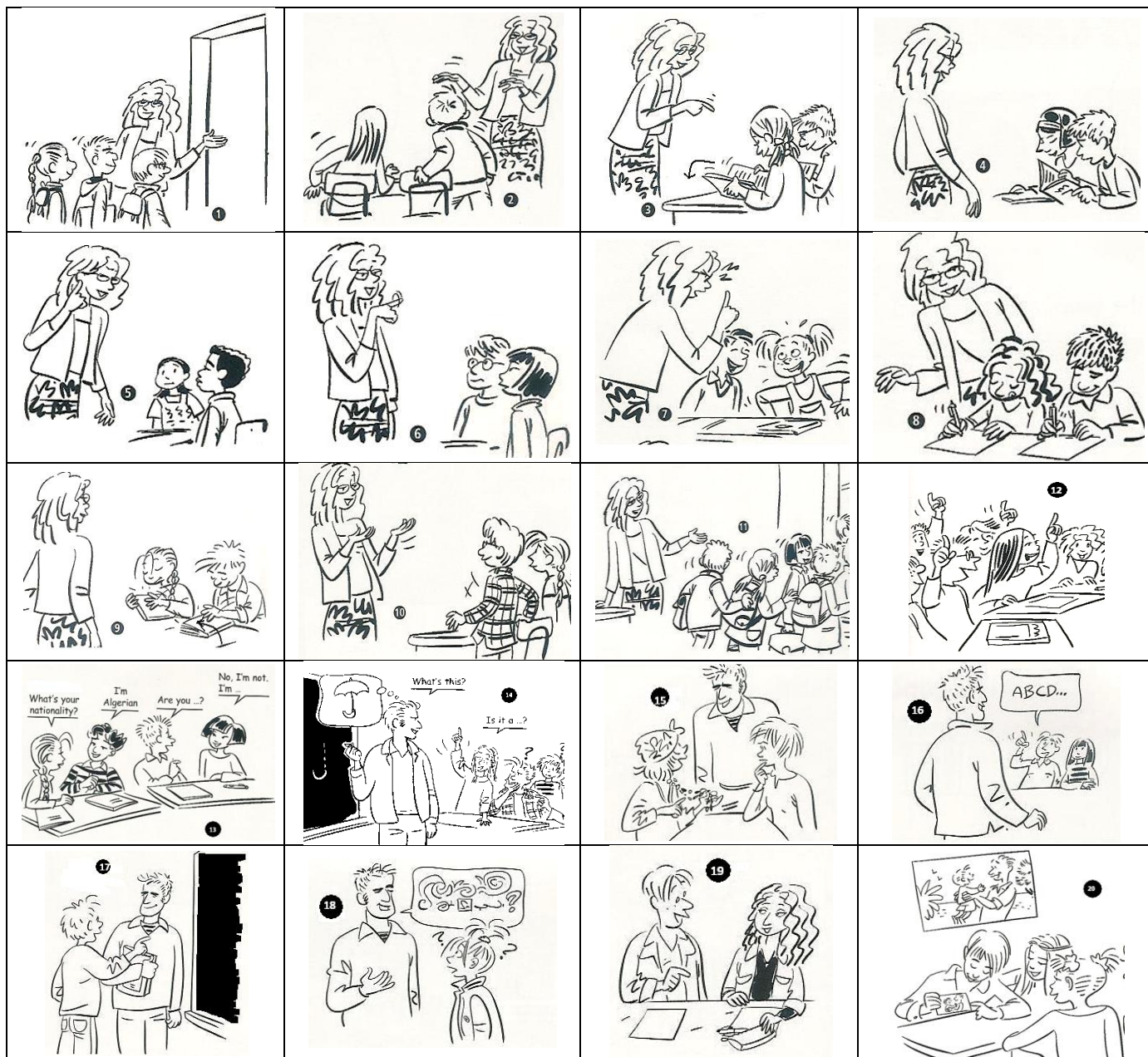

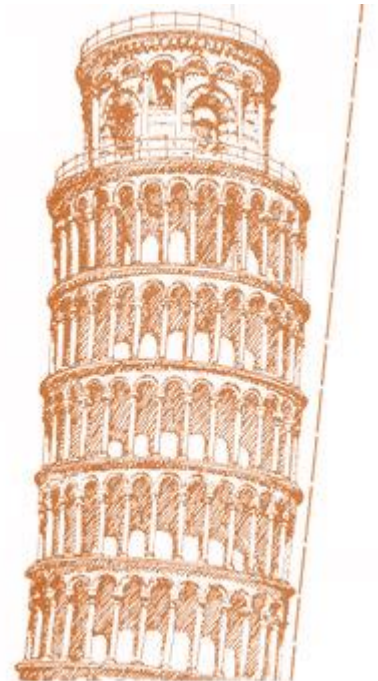

## PAST SIMPLE

Form: we add "ed" to all regular verbs,  
*Irregular verbs must be learnt by heart.*

We use the Past Simple for something in the past which is finished.

- He *played* tennis *yesterday*.
- The children *went* to the park *this morning*.

We use "did" to make questions and "didn't" for negatives. The verb stays in the base form.

- *Did you see* Bob yesterday?
- They *didn't come* to the party on Sunday.

## PRESENT PERFECT

Form: *has/have + past participle*

We use the present perfect for an action in the past with a result now or when we talk about a time from the past until now.

- *I've lost* my glasses. (I can't find them now)
- *I've been* to Spain, but I haven't been to Portugal.

We use: *hasn't/haven't + past participle* for negatives:

- John *hasn't seen* the film.

We use: *has/have + subject + past participle* for questions:

- *Have you seen* Jane today?

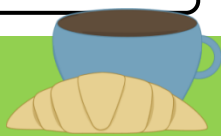
