

TRIP

- ❖ a small suitcase
- ❖ A terracotta dish
- ❖ An excursion or journey especially for pleasure

(n) An excursion or journey to somewhere and then back home - especially for pleasure.

Sammy is on a school trip today

TRAVEL

- ❖ a type of vehicle (e.g. car/bus/train)
- ❖ move from one place to another
- ❖ pass through a building

(v) Move from one place to another. To move along a road or through a region.

He travelled the world with the Army.

JOURNEY

- ❖ a system using GPS.
- ❖ a short sleep
- ❖ a distance travelled in a specific time

(n) a distance travelled in a specific time. An act of travel from one place to another.

The journey took 8 hours.

CRUISE

- ❖ a fighter jet place (like in the film Top Gun)
- ❖ a trip on a large ship
- ❖ a truck with a trailer

(n) A trip on a large ship. Take a holiday on a ship with a predetermined course, often stopping at places of interest.

We are going on a cruise around the Caribbean.

TOUR

- ❖ a very tall tower with a bell
- ❖ a journey finding out information
- ❖ a delicious sandwich with bacon

(n) A journey for pleasure where different places are visited and where you discover information – often with a guide

Have you been on a tour of Turin?

VOYAGE

- ❖ a journey by sea
- ❖ a space ship
- ❖ an absorbant paper cloth used in the kitchen

(*n*) A long journey involving travel by sea or in space.

Christopher Columbus' voyage to America changed history.

FLIGHT

- ❖ a green vegetable
- ❖ a collective noun for ships
- ❖ a journey in the air

(n) A journey in the air (or in space) – especially a timetabled journey organised by an airline

The British Airways flight travels from Turin to Gatwick airport.
